Following discussion, it was the consensus of Council to proceed with the July 3 fireworks show and the July 4 Independence Day parade. The parade route will be moved to 14th Street, between George Hopper Road and Highway 287 bypass; participants (floats) will remain stationary while parade-goers drive by in their vehicles. The change in the parade route will be disseminated out to the public as soon as possible. A mayoral proclamation will be issued allowing crowds of 100 or more to view the July 3 fireworks show, and to advise citizens to follow guidelines pertaining to outdoor public assemblies as specified in Governor Abbott's most recent executive order GA-28


