

Proclamation

WHEREAS, on June 30, 2020, I, Mayor Richard Reno, issued a Proclamation in response to Governor Gregg Abbott Executive Order GA-28, proclaiming that gatherings in excess of 100 people may be allowed to view the July 3 Fireworks Show and further addressed the Independence Day parade changes including the parade route; and

WHEREAS, on July 2, 2020 Governor Gregg Abbott issued a Proclamation amending Executive Order GA-28, proclaiming that outdoor gatherings in excess of 10 people within the City limits requires the approval of the Mayor; and

WHEREAS the Independence Day Parade and the July 3 Fireworks Show will still proceed as scheduled. For the fireworks viewing, it is recommended that attendees remain close to their vehicles and where possible avoid mingling with other groups, minimizing contact with others that are not in the same household and keeping a 6-foot distance from others not in the same household.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Richard Reno, Mayor of the City of Midlothian, Texas, do hereby proclaim that outdoor gatherings in excess of 10 people may be allowed within the City of Midlothian. However, Citizens are advised to follow guidelines pertaining to outdoor gatherings contained in Executive Order GA-28 issued on June 26, 2020 and the Proclamation amending Executive Order GA-28 issued on July 2, 2020.
